Children/Youth who demonstrate risk factors associated with the following:

- ❖ Aggressive behavior (Anger management Issues)
- ❖ Parent/Child Conflict
- ❖ Inappropriate behavior to learning
- ❖ Basic needs not met
- ❖ Special medical needs
- ❖ Children under 4 years of age
- ❖ Sexual minority youth
- ❖ Child's Temperament or Insecure attachment
- ❖ Separation & Divorce

Families who demonstrate risk factors associated with the following:

- ❖ Family violence
- ❖ Social isolation
- ❖ Harsh discipline
- ❖ Transience
- ❖ Poverty/Unemployment
- ❖ Conflict/Violence
- ❖ Low parent involvement

Parent(s) who demonstrate risk factors associated with the following:

- ❖ Parent's Mental Health
- ❖ Parent's Substance Abuse
- ❖ Parent's own history of abuse
- ❖ Young Parent
- ❖ Parent's Belief in corporal punishment
- ❖ Poor understanding of child development

Community that demonstrates risk factors associated with the following:

- ❖ Drug trafficking
- ❖ Violence in the community
- ❖ Poor housing
- ❖ Lack of access to services

HOW TO ACCESS THE SERVICES OF THE CHILD'S CIRCLE PROGRAM:



Complete a Referral Form. Referrals can be obtained by contacting your child's school or the Child's Circle Worker directly. Parents, teachers, administrators, students or community agencies can make referrals.



If the family, youth and/or child qualifies for services, the Child's Circle Worker will coordinate a meeting to develop a service plan.



The Child's Circle Worker will work collaboratively with the family, youth, child, school personnel, and community agencies to implement a service plan that best meets the needs of the family.



The Child's Circle Worker will work in partnership with family, youth, and/or child to provide in-home supports, parenting programs, family supports and transition services.

To provide support, guidance and mentorship to the family.
