Junior high students use a tool called myBlueprint to **explore strengths and learn more about personal interests and values.** They also start connecting what they're learning in school to real-world careers.


By high school, students' myBlueprint profiles are nearly complete with actionable and detailed plans for their future—whether that includes college, university, or heading straight into a career. **Preparing students for life after graduation and building skills for employment is a priority for our Division.**

Through strong **partnerships with post-secondary institutions** across Alberta, many FVSD students have the chance to take college-level courses in high school. When our students complete high school, they're not only ready for further education—they're prepared to join the local workforce with confidence.



Did you know that Alberta has grades 13 and 14? This is a great way to take advantage of collegiate programming while remaining in the public school system.

Individuals under 20 years old as of September 1 are eligible to enroll with Pathways and take college level courses as an FVSD student!



Alternative Education Options

Pathways School (Outreach)

Pathways offers families a **flexible** alternative to a traditional school experience.

Program choices include online courses with access to direct instruction, self-directed courses in which the student takes ownership of their own learning, and dual credit cohorts designed for students wanting to complete college level courses for credit while also completing high school requirements.

Pathways also provides **blended programming** to homeschool students wanting to complete courses from the *Alberta* curriculum while remaining enrolled in home education.

Northern Home Education Centre

With Northern Home Education Centre (NHEC) you can **create a customized education plan** specific to your teaching abilities and your child's unique needs, learning styles, and strengths and/or weaknesses.

Options include traditional homeschooling with parents in full control over the curriculum, *Alberta Education* aligned programming that follows the provincial curriculum, and blended programming that offers a combination of the above.

The goal of NHEC is to meet the diverse needs of families and provide the most appropriate education program to help their children find success.

Getting to School

In Town & Rural Bus Service

Children in **Kindergarten** and **grades 1-6** who live a distance **greater than 1 km from their school,** and students in **grades 7-12** who live a distance **greater than 2 km from their school** qualify to ride the bus at no charge.

These students have been automatically registered to ride the bus and **you will receive a phone call from your bus driver before the first day of school.** Families will receive an automated text to confirm ridership and address. *If you think you qualify but did not receive a text message, phone Essential Services and they will confirm.*

Students in Kindergarten and grades 1-6 who live within 1 km, and students in grades 7-12 who live within 2 km from their school do not qualify for bussing. Parents of students who do not qualify are responsible for arranging their own transportation to and from school. We encourage families living close to their school(s) to consider allowing their children to walk, bike, or scooter to school during warmer months.

NOTE: Because the distance is calculated from each child's school, some parents may have children who qualify for bussing and children who don't qualify living in the same household.

Unsafe Driving Conditions

The Superintendent, in consultation with the Director of Essential Services, has authority to suspend, cancel or reroute bus service as necessary.

Bus service in affected areas will be canceled by 6:30 AM by the Director of Essential Services **when the temperature reaches -40°C without the wind, or -48°C with the wind** as measured by Environment Canada Data. This will be posted to the division website and school Facebook pages.

In the event of a bus cancellation, drivers will inform all parents on the route as soon as possible. **ALL STUDENTS riding the bus are required to wear adequate clothing to ensure their safety during cold weather.**

Families that are new to the area or have moved over the summer, please call FVSD Essential Services to check bussing eligibility and/or update location information. New students MUST be registered with their school before bussing will be approved.

Special Requests

Yard Service Fees

Yard service is available for a cost of **\$75/month.** In order to receive yard service, **the yard MUST:**

- Have a driveway wide enough to accommodate the bus,
- Have an appropriate space to turn the bus around with sufficient clearance from any items in the yard such as vehicles, ATV's, sheds, etc.
- Have snow promptly and regularly cleared from the yard and driveway in winter.
- Have a driveway and turn around area that is not excessively muddy.

Yard service will be provided at no cost for:

- Families with a student that is physically disabled.
- Families with a driveway in a location that does not allow for safe pickup at the road.

In an effort to control costs and ride times, **each yard service will be re-evaluated for the coming year.** Having received yard service in the past is *not* a guarantee of receiving it again this year. *If applicable, fees must be paid prior to commencement of yard service.*

Cross Boundary Transfers

Cross boundary transfers for children attending a school outside of their attendance boundary MUST be approved by the Director of Essential Services.
