HISTORY OF SISTER FLORENCE MACDOUGALL

Sister Marie MacDougall was born and raised in St. Joseph's Parish, Antigonish, Nova Scotia. Prior to her entry into the Sisters of Service in 1943, she taught in schools in Bruderheim and Yaroslaw, Alberta. After her profession, Sister taught in Wexford, Ontario and Rycroft, Manning, Peace River, and High Level in northern Alberta.

Sister's specialty was in Primary Education and because of this specialty and her many years of experience, she was often asked to introduce young teachers to the arts and skills of instructing young children in their formative years, which she considered a joy and a privilege, and did wholeheartedly.

In June 1979, the Order of the Royal Purple presented Sister with a ten-year School Perfect Attendance plaque, and the students and staff of the High Level Public School dedicated their 1979-80 book of memories "to a special teacher who will remain in our hearts and memories for years to come".

Sister died in the 38th year of her religious life on May 13, 1981 in the Misericordia Hospital, Edmonton. Father John Spicer, C.S.S.R.. and Father John Hess concelebrated Mass of the Resurrection in St. Joseph's Cathedral on May 15. After the nephew, Mass, Sister's Dr. David MacDougall, played a traditional lament on the bagpipes.

Interment was in St. Joachim's Cemetary, Edmonton, Alberta.

OFFICE PROCEDURES

Daily office hours are 8:00 AM – 3:30 PM. The phone number is 780-926-2331, and the email address is flomac@fvsd.ab.ca.

If a child is under a custody order, we MUST have a copy of it in order to abide by it.

TRANSPORTATION & BUSSING

School doors open and morning supervision starts at 8:30 AM.

Bus arrivals and departures are supervised. Bus drivers explain expected student behavior and safety procedure.

780-928-3860 for bussing information and to register.

Busses may not be operational on bad weather days; however, the school is open. The *Radio Stations* **CKYL 102.1** and **KIX FM 106.1** usually announce if the busses are not running due to inclement weather. You may also download the **FREE Bus Status** app by *Box Clever* from the *iTunes* store or *Google Play*.

Our *website* also displays all current bus statuses on the home page (fmcs.fvsd.ab.ca).

Children riding busses are required to dress warmly in case the bus breaks down.

Students will be sent home by their regular means unless PARENTS advise us of a different arrangement.

STUDENT LOADING ZONE

Please follow all posted signage during pickup and drop off times.

If you drop your children off or pick them up in front of the school, please use the **west side** of Rainbow Boulevard.

NO CHILDREN should be dropped off on the EAST SIDE of Rainbow Boulevard.

ABSENTEEISM & TARDINESS

Regular attendance is a requirement of the School Act. Please ensure that your child is absent only when necessary (ie. sickness, medical appointments).

Punctuality is a general expectation for all.

For safety reasons, children arriving late MUST use the front doors of the school and check in at the office before proceeding to class.

If a child is habitually late or absent, the parents or guardians will be contacted.

ABSENCE AUTOMATED CALL OUT

The purpose of this program is to inform parents that their child has not arrived at school.

Whenever your child will be absent, please call the school at 780-926-2331, or email flomac@fvsd.ab.ca by 8:45 AM.

At 9:20 AM when the student is not accounted for your child's information will be uploaded to our call out system. If you choose not to be a part of our program, please call the school.

TELEPHONE POLICY

Children have access to the phone to call parents if they are not feeling well or if they have forgotten their lunch.

Students MAY NOT use the phone to make arrangements to visit friends.

STAFF

All teachers at Florence MacDougall Community School are certified to teach in the province of Alberta. All staff must provide a criminal record check and a vulnerable sector check prior to employment with Fort Vermilion School Division #52.

WEATHER POLICY

Students will be outdoors at recess when at all possible. This includes rainy days and when temperatures are above -25°C.

Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately.

FOOTWEAR

Students MUST have indoor shoes. This is necessary in the event of a fire drill or a fire.

Please label your child's shoes with their name.

ILLNESS & INJURY

When children are ill, it is undesirable for them to be at school. Their health is regained more slowly, they learn little, and there is the possibility of others coming into contact with the illness.

If a child becomes ill during the day, the parent or guardian will be contacted to take the child home. In the case of injury on the playground or in the school, the child is taken to the infirmary. If the injury is very minor, appropriate first aid is used. If the injury appears more serious, the parent or guardian will be notified.

It is extremely important that we have your CURRENT PHONE NUMBER, as well as a work number or alternative number.

FIRE DRILLS & LOCKDOWNS

Fire Drills and Lockdowns are conducted throughout the year. Plans are posted in each classroom to ensure a safe and orderly procedure.

EMERGENCIES

In case of an emergency the students of Florence MacDougall Community School will be evacuated to the High Level Public School gymnasium.

COMMUNITY HEALTH

The Public Health Nurse visits the school as required to do immunizations and tuberculin skin test if parental consent has been granted.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

Please inform the school of any medical problems your child may have. It is necessary for us to know about the problem and the immediate treatment if we are to respond appropriately in an emergency situation.

LIBRARY

There are a wide variety of books, online resources and magazines in our library for students.

Students are allowed to sign out books for a two week period. If library books are lost, students are expected to pay replacement cost.



PEANUT/NUT SAFE POLICY

Due to severe allergic conditions within our student body, **FMCS IS A PEANUT/NUT FREE ZONE**.

This includes peanuts, almonds, cashews, hazelnuts, macadamia nuts, pecans, walnuts or any type of tree nut.

It is very important that all parents and students help us by not sending peanuts/nuts or food containing them to school. Our goal is to create an environment where all children are safe and comfortable. Thank you for your assistance in this area.

SKATEBOARD/ROLLER BLADE, SCOOTER & BIKE POLICY

Students are asked to bring a bike lock to help secure their bike or scooter during the day. For safety reasons, they are not to be used on school property during the school day.

EFFECTIVE BEHAVIOR SUPPORT (EBS)

At FMCS we believe that a positive approach to discipline and teaching students appropriate behaviors throughout the year will help them to be successful, safe and secure. EBS is a system that we use to help our children learn the expected behaviors and reward those same behaviors. We have four school wide rules (see below) that we teach the children; and we provide them with positive examples to be successful.

Children identified as following the rules will be rewarded with a *Bear Hug*. This certificate is collected in the office and will be entered for the chance to win a prize. In our EBS system we reward students for positive behavior. This teaches children that appropriate behaviors are worthwhile.
