# Buffalo Head Prairie School School Council Meeting- February 26, 2024

- 1. Call to Order at 7:03 pm
- 2. Approval of Agenda
- 3. M/S Danny/Ryan that the agenda be approved. Carried
- 4. Minutes from Previous Meeting Katharine read the January 29, 2024, meeting minutes.
- 5. Approval of Previous Minutes M/S Mike/Ryan that the January 29, 2024, minutes be accepted as presented. Carried.
- 6. Chairperson's Report

Construction update. Mr. McMann is working on getting approval for extra classroom space.

#### 7. Principal's Report

- a. Parent/Teacher Interviews will be moved to 10-minute time slots for everyone for upcoming interviews due to large class sizes and time constraints. Parents with children in small class sizes may request a double appointment if they feel it is necessary.
- b. Staffing Update- BHPS has been allocated another teacher for the 2024-2025 year and this is currently advertised as a grade 3 position. Mr. Fehr and Mr. Driedger are in the process of interviewing candidates for this position as well as for a grade two position (currently Mrs. Wiseman and Mr. Rodgers which was a one-year position).
- c. Pre-ECS currently has 27 students enrolled and this number will likely be higher for Kindergarten. Mrs. Darlene Wieler and Mrs. Trudy Klassen will be leading the Pre-ECS class this year. Pre-ECS parent meeting is scheduled for March 12 at 4:30pm. First day of Pre-ECS is March 19 and will run from 1:00-2:30pm, Tuesdays and Thursdays this year. No Pre-ECS students will be allowed to go on the bus this year as busses are too full.
- d. Playground Pole Structure for BHPS. Council members saw this as being valuable for the community. Some funds are available from our SGF Budget and Trustee Zacharias suggested it might be worthwhile applying for a matching grant from the FVSD.
- e. Hand games in FVSD and at BHPS. Mr. Driedger has investigated this further and talked to Abe Klassen about the Hand Games. Abe Klassen has reassured us that there is no spiritual connection and is highly respectful. The games are purely recreational. BHPS is expected to send some students to the Hand Games in Meander, Upper Hay River School. A majority of council members agreed that they would support this.
- f. Susan Siemens is willing to present a slide show about Mennonite Culture in our school. She will attend our March School Council meeting and present to council members first before going forward.
- g. School Calendar- School Council is supportive of the calendar. Happy that we do not have much longer school days, PD days eliminated. Miss Haag indicate that some teachers are currently a little apprehensive about PD hours after school, which is yet to be finalized.
- h. Projecting 280 or more students for 2024-2025 (official projection from central office is 278 students). Mr. McMann is working on getting extra classroom space built. The ball is rolling on this, but it is a slow process.
- i. Students wearing jackets at recess time. School council parents were asked for their suggestions on what to expect as the weather warmed up for spring. Council suggested that K-3 students should be expected to wear jackets and ski pants if they were sent along from home. Grade 4-9 are encouraged to wear their jackets but should be able use their own discretion whether to wear a jacket. Mr. Fehr indicated that staff will move forward with this expectation of students based on the recommendation from school council parents.

#### 8. Financial Update

#### a. SGF Budget Review

Approximately \$63,000 in SGF. Some of these budget lines are no longer being used with dollars in them. It is possible that some funds could be used to build a pole shelter for the school community.

#### b. Operational Budget Review

45% spent at end of January (February expenditures not finalized). We are in good financial standing and will likely have a small financial surplus at year end.

c. Trustee Information: No Report
