School Presentation to the Board: Divisional Priorities

School: Florence MacDougall Community School

Date of Report: April 10, 2024

School Context:

FMCS is a Kindergarten to Grade 3 school with an Early Intervention program for 3- and 4-year-olds. We have a current enrollment of 350 students, with a staff of two administrators, one full-time Inclusive Education Coordinator, 17 teachers, and 21 support staff. Our student population comes from a wide demographic, with varied cultural and economic backgrounds. We have a transient population with multiple students moving in and out during the school year. There is a wide range of skills and abilities in each class so significant differentiation in instruction is needed.

Literacy: Ensure all teachers can teach reading and strategies for building comprehension, focusing on oral language.

Celebration: Our school's focus is to build students' reading comprehension while simultaneously building teacher capacity in teaching comprehension strategies. Intentional oral language instruction is a building block to achieving this goal. In relation to building comprehension ability, Grade 3 students taking part in a new Empower Comprehension intervention demonstrated a 7-point increase in standard score on TOSREC (Comprehension testing). In Kindergarten, after the implementation of Story Champs intervention, 9% of students were no longer considered at risk as measured by the Adlof Oral Language Screener.

Growth Area: Overall Comprehension scores are low, particularly in Grade 1, demonstrating a continued need to focus on oral language and growing capacity.

Numeracy: All students will demonstrate increased confidence with, and the ability to discuss and understand numeracy concepts; with a focus on facilitating mathematical discourse to teach number sense.

Celebration: Grade 2 demonstrated a significant increase in both PNSA and WRAT-5 results due to intervention and content coaching for teachers.

Growth Area: PNSA scores did not show a significant increase in kindergarten so we will be working towards a scope and sequence to support capacity building.

Connectivity in the Community:

Celebration: 98% of students in FMCS who took the Connectivity Survey responded excited or happy to the question: the adults in the school make me feel? We would also like to celebrate more involvement in our Parent Council and Friends of Flo Mac groups.

Fall 2023 Connectivity Survey Results

Adults- 98% Other kids- 88% Most days- 85%

Growth Area: 15% (18 students) of students in FMCS who took the Connectivity Survey responded sad or worried to the question: how do I feel most days at school? We will look at specifics related to reasoning, participation, and programming to target those students' needs based on further questioning to those sad/worried responses.

Career Path: (talk about your future plan)

Celebration: At FMCS we currently focus on providing exploratory learning related to careers through thematic dramatic play in Early Intervention and Kindergarten.

Growth Area: Our future plan is to be more purposeful in planning our dramatic play and exploratory learning to align with the new priorities outlined by the Collegiate Explore Director. This will also need to extend beyond our Early Intervention and Kindergarten classrooms into Grades 1-3.

School Presentation to the Board: Divisional Priorities

School: Ridgeview Central School

Date of Report: April 17, 2024

School Context:

Located in the town of La Crete, AB, our school serves students in grades 4-6, totaling 220 students primarily from a Mennonite background. Our dedicated staff comprises 12 teaching staff members, 6 support staff members, 1 secretary, and 1 librarian. We have 4 grade 4 classes, 3 grade 5 classes, and 3 grade 6 classes, providing a comprehensive educational experience for our students.

Goals as per assurance plan:

Literacy – have less than 29% below average in TOSREC (improving reading comprehension is a focus). Numeracy – have less than 39% below average in the WRAT score with a focus on fluency. Connectivity – have all students feel safe and accepted at school.

Literacy:

Celebration: Strongest achievement to date based on your Power BI Data

- Our TOSWRF and TOWRE numbers have always been strong.
- We believe that a lot of credit goes to the strong phonological and morphology programs that they run at Sandhills.
- This is not necessarily a celebration of what has or is being done at Ridgeview, but it does give us a strong foundation to build on.


Spring TOSWRF 2022

Median Scores Fall Winter










TOSREC - Grade 6 - 2023-24



We do celebrate the gains that our students make in comprehension.

- Previous scores show that the same group of students has continually made gains throughout their time at Ridgeview.
- There are less kids below average every year.

Growth Area: Strongest data point that requires growth in your School.

- Although we celebrate the growth that we have seen in comprehension, this is still an area where we have an opportunity for growth.
- As student move from learning to read (Div 1) which focuses on decoding, we move to reading to learn (comprehension).
- Since they have now learned to read, they will continue to improve their fluency by reading.
- Comprehension is needed for them to be better learners. Comprehension will be a focus in the upcoming year.
- This will be accomplished by having teachers invest time into the assurance plan that will guide our focus areas (comprehension) in the upcoming years.
- Grade level teams will develop strategies on how to improve comprehension as a whole class (tier 1 intervention). Teachers will be expected to reflect on how well their strategies work by analyzing the data.

Content coaches will assist with developing strategies.

Numeracy:

Celebration: Strongest achievement to date based on your Power BI Data

- In the three years that we have been collecting data, our Math numbers have improved.
- If we look at the first set of grade 4's from 2021-22 and compare them year to year, we can see the improvements.


Grade 4 Winter – 2021 – 2022

- Another area of celebration is our math scores as a whole school.
- 60% of our students are at average or above.
- We have also grown 6 points from fall to winter, which is really good.
- This can be attributed to teachers working with our math coach and adopting more guided math practices.

Current Whole School Median Scores Fall Winter Spring N/A Below Average 40.5% Average and Above 59.5%


Growth Area: Strongest data point that requires growth in your School.

- We need to continue to have teachers work as grade teams on developing number fluency.
- This will be done by teaching students how to manipulate numbers for them to quickly and confidently calculate them mentally. Eg.friendly numbers
- The principal and assistant principal need to have a good understanding of the strategies that the teachers are using in their classrooms.
- Open and frank discussions need to be had while examining the data and discussing which strategies have been successful and which ones have not.
- Our content coaches need to continue to work with teachers to develop teaching strategies.
