Literacy and Numeracy Interventions Update

This year at BHPS, staff have been leading daily literacy and numeracy interventions with many students in elementary grades. These programs are research-based, and staff leaders have been trained in how to deliver these programs to ensure students receive the best learning support possible. Small group interventions are daily, thirty-minute classes, that run for specific time periods throughout the school year. Each session provides intensive instruction to help each student learn and grow in areas of need. We have observed that these intervention learning opportunities have made a positive difference in student learning.

We feel fortunate to be part of the Buffalo Head Prairie School community and feel cared for as a staff by this wonderful community. Over the past 7 years, our student population has doubled. We have enjoyed growth in our student learning results, both in literacy and numeracy. None of these things would be possible without the willingness of parents, students, and staff to work together as partners in the learning team. Although there are many positives, we continue to strive for growth and improvement.
